- Comprehend OSHA's material handling requirements specific to commercial and industrial vehicles (Subpart N Materials Handling and Storage)
- Observe the guarding requirements for specific types of machinery and equipment (Subpart O Machinery and Machine Guarding)
- Recognize the different hazards associated with electricity and electrical equipment (Subpart S Electrical)
- Define the purpose of the Hazard Communication Standard (HCS) (Subpart Z Toxic and Hazardous Substances)


