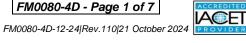
























Armed with these, the manager will be able to gain an insight into the exciting world of the management of the finances of a company. Starting with the objective of the firm and an understanding of the financial system, the course progressively builds up concepts and aids the participant in applying these concepts to decision situations from various non-finance functions. Finally, the course is wrapped up by looking at ways to link managerial performance assessment with the goal of wealth maximization for the providers of capital.

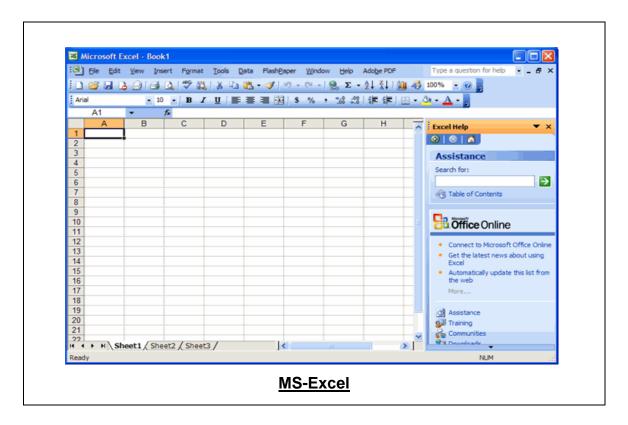






Simulator (Hands-on Practical Sessions)
