Course Description



This practical and highly-interactive course includes various practical sessions and exercises. Theory learnt will be applied using one of our state-of-the-art first aid simulators.

First Aid is the assistance given to any person suffering a sudden illness or injury, with care provided to preserve life prevent the condition from worsening, and/or promote recovery. It includes initial intervention in a serious condition prior to professional medical help being available, such as performing CPR while waiting an ambulance, as well as the complete treatment of minor conditions, such as applying a plaster to a cut.



This course is designed to provide participants with a basic overview of First Aid. It covers the responsibilities and limitations of a first aider; assessing the situation and conducting a primary survey by checking for responsiveness, airway, breathing and circulation (DRABC); the basic life support (BLS) and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR); the techniques for managing bleeding and shock; the first aid for heart problems and stroke, asthma, hyperventilation and allergic reactions; and assessing and treating diabetic emergencies and poisoning cases.





During this interactive course, participants will learn the first aid for epileptic seizures and head injuries; managing chest, neck and back injuries, burns, electrical injuries and eye injuries; the various first aid scenarios to practice skills in a controlled environment; and the behavioral techniques for managing stress and staying composed during emergencies.
